In the Community Handbook, where you read:

P. 46:

• All applicants to CLIP are considered, regardless of their ethnicity, religion, sex, or national origin. Students with severe learning disabilities, who require specialized instruction not currently available at the school, cannot be considered for admission. All applicants to CLIP are interviewed and assessed by the respective Director of the relevant School or their representative. A profile of each candidate is developed, which includes quantitative and qualitative data. The former involves testing results and school records, such as grade and progress reports, exam and test results, psychological and/or psychiatric assessments, etc. Qualitative data includes student interviews, home assessments and personal observations made by staff. The above notwithstanding, CLIP is a non-selective school.

Eligibility Requirements – Language · English is the language of instruction at all year levels. The ability to access the curriculum successfully within a reasonable time and to thrive in our English-language learning environment are the guiding principles for admission to the school. English as Additional Language (EAL) support is offered within our academic programme.

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
